WHEREAS the derogation will not hinder the neighbouring building, even though the non-conforming section of the lateral setback has a full-light glass door, and as the right to direct view, or 1.5 m, under the Civil Code of Quebec (Art. 993), is respected;

WHEREAS the request complies with the urbanism plan;

WHEREAS the CCUP recommends that municipal Council approve the request for minor derogation.
