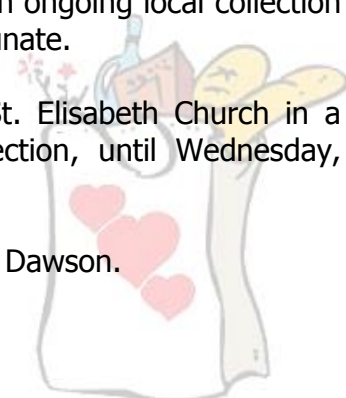
DONATION OF NON-PERISHABLE FOOD ITEMS

ESTRIA CONCERTS AT ST. ELIZABETH CHURCH

The Estria concert season continues in 2019 with two presentations at the St. Elizabeth Church in February and March 2019.

The presentation of *À tour d'anches* will take place on Saturday, February 16th at 3 pm with three musicians on stage: Étienne de Médicis on oboe; Pauline Farrugia on the clarinet and saxophone; and Tristan Longval-Gagné at the piano. A wonderful selection of romantic and virtuosic works will be on the menu by composers Robert Schumann, Franz Schubert, Francis Poulenc, Johann Kalliwoda, Jacques Ibert and Eugène Bozza.

Saturday, April 6th at 3 pm the production of *All Good Things ...* **will close Estria's 20th and final season.** On this occasion, flautist Myriam Genest-Denis, bassoonist Karine Breton, and horn player Maude Lussier will join Mr. De Médicis, Mrs. Farrugia and Mr. Longval-Gagné in a program of works for woodwind quintet and piano by the composers Antoine Reicha, Georges Bizet (*Carmen Suite*), Albert Roussel, Francis Poulenc and Maurice Ravel.

To mark the event, everyone who attends the concert will receive a gift of the Estria Quintet's two CDs (ATMA Classique) and a celebratory glass will be served after the concert.

The price of admission for each concert is \$15 general admission

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR THE WINTER SEASON



OVERNIGHT PARKING

A reminder that in keeping with by-law # 2018-611, overnight parking is prohibited on all public roads and in the municipal parking lot during the winter season, from November 1 to April 1, between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

All illegally parked vehicles will be towed away at the owner's expense and are subject to a fine.

We thank you for your cooperation.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

- Use CSA, ETL or UL certified decorative light brands;
- Check manufacturer instructions before stringing holiday lights;
- Make sure that all holiday lights are in good working condition. Do not string lights if the wire is damaged or dried out, if the sockets are cracked or if strings are frayed or connections unstable;
- Replace all defective bulbs;
- Avoid bulbs touching the power cord connection or any other electrical cord;
- Do not cover strung lights with fabric, paper or other type of material;
- Avoid using string lights other than during the Holiday Season. They are not designed to be used on a long-term basis.

CLEAR ACCESS TO FIRE HYDRANTS

The Fire Department and Public Works Department would like to remind you that it is very important that access to fire hydrants (1-metre circumference around the hydrant) always be cleared of snow from your property.

Quick access to the hydrants in the event of an emergency is essential at all times.

EMERGENCY EXIT

An important reminder to always clear your balcony and doorways of snow following a snowfall.

A second exit should be cleared of snow at all times in case of an emergency.

SNOW REMOVAL

Please note that in accordance with municipal regulations, it is forbidden to dump snow from your property onto the road, the sidewalks, into the lake and onto any municipal property.

Please do not leave your garbage and recycling bins at the side of the road so as not to hinder snow removal and to avoid damage to your bins.



WASTE MANAGEMENT

Trash bin:

- Garland (metallic or laminated);
- Wrapping paper (metallic or laminated);
- Gift bags (metallic or laminated);
- Christmas lights (recyclable at ecocentres);
- Artificial Christmas tree (recyclable at ecocentres).

Recycling bin:

- Tissue paper;
- Plastic tablecloth (cleaned and placed in a plastic bag);
- **NON**-laminated paper gift bags (with ribbon or cord handle removed).

Compost bin:

- Soiled paper tablecloths;
- Paper napkins;
- **NON**-laminated cardboard dishes;
- Compostable dishes identified as such

WINTER COMPOSTING

As of November 9, compost bin collection takes place once a month only.

To prevent compost items from freezing and sticking to the bin, compostable liners can be purchased at a number of stores. You can also place a piece of flat cardboard at the bottom of your empty bin to avoid freezing and sticking of any compost material.

We also recommend that you avoid disposing of liquids in your brown bin.
