On Sunday, October 21, citizens will be called upon to elect a new representative to fill municipal Council seat #5.


Advance polling will take place on October 14. As in past years, voting by mail is also an option.

#### **Chimney Cleaning**

With the approaching cooler weather, many among us will warm up by the stove or fireplace. With good chimney maintenance, you can enjoy the warmth of your stove or fireplace safely and worry free.

Keep in mind that a chimney fire can cause major damage to a building and is the reason why it is so important to have a chimney that is connected to any heating system (fireplace, stove, furnace, etc.) cleaned at least once a year.

You can clean your chimney yourself or have the work done by a professional chimney cleaner.

For your own safety, hire a qualified professional to do the work. It is recommended to check with the Association des professionnels en chauffage (APC) and consult the list of qualified members. If the chimney cleaner also has to carry out repairs to the chimney or fireplace, it is also recommended to make sure that the professional has a permit from the Régie du bâtiment du Québec.

Ask for a receipt that confirms that the chimney cleaning took place.

The Municipality of the Village of North Hatley neither recommends nor endorses any particular chimney cleaning firm.



#### WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A POWER OUTAGE

A reminder that in order to get details relative to a power failure such as how long before power is to be reinstated or what is the cause of the power outage, you should contact Hydro-Québec - Outages and Emergencies - at <u>1-800-790-2424</u> and follow the instructions given in the menu. However, before contacting Hydro-Québec check to see if your immediate neighbours are also affected and that the outage is not due to a short or other defect in the hydro supply system to your own residence.

#### LEAF COLLECTION

This year leaf collection will take place on October 29, November 5 and 12, 2018.

Follow the steps below to ensure that your leaves will be picked up.

- The leaves must be placed in compostable paper bags;
- No plastic bags will be picked up;
- The bags must be free of pine or fir needles or any other type of waste;
- The bags must be placed at the side of the road and not on public roads.

In addition to leaf collection, there are other alternatives available for recycling dead leaves:

- 1. Shred small amounts of leaves with your lawn mower; they make an ideal fertilizer.
- 2. Dispose of leaves in your brown bin (compostable matter).
- 3. Spread shredded leaves on your flowerbeds: they provide winter cover and food for your plants. Shredded leaves should be spread late in the fall when plants are dormant.
- 4. Cover your vegetable garden with leaves. Soil doesn't do well when exposed to the elements and can become packed down from the effects of snow and rain. Leaves can be kept covered with netting or grate or watertight membrane. In the spring, leaves can be left in place, they will decompose progressively.



#### TEMPORARY CAR SHELTERS

Temporary car shelters (tempos) are permitted from November 1<sup>st</sup> to April 15<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

They must consist of a metal frame with a canvas or polyethylene cover.

They must be installed on a parking spot or access road, at a minimum distance of 1.5 metres (5'), or 3 metres (9'9") for a corner property, from the edge of the main thoroughfare.

Car shelters must be dismantled (including the frame) and stored outside the stated dates.

#### **OVERNIGHT PARKING**

A reminder that under By-law 2010-544, overnight parking is prohibited on all public roads and at the municipal parking lot during the winter season, from **November 1 to April 1, between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.** 

All illegally parked vehicles will be towed away immediately at the owner's expense and be subject to a fine.

#### **Pleasant View Beach Park**

Fall usually comes with more warm sunny days, so why not enjoy them outdoors!

Whether to have a picnic with family or friends or to take in the fall foliage, you can obtain an electronic transponder key that will give you access to Pleasant View Beach Park outside supervised hours.

Entrance is free for residents and non-residents by filling out a form at the North Hatley Town Hall, 3125, chemin Capelton.

A \$20 deposit will be refunded when the key is returned, undamaged.



#### **Last weekends for the Wippi Shuttle**

The Wippi Shuttle can accommodate up to 12 passengers, with or without bicycles, and crosses the lake between Ayer's Cliff and North Hatley from two municipal wharfs.

The shuttle is equipped with bike racks to secure them in place during the crossing. It's an optimal way of connecting the Grandes Fourches bike trail (Axe du sommet or Axe de la Massawippi) to the Tomifobia Nature Trail bike trail while taking in the stunning fall scenery.

The Wippi Shuttle will operate on the following end-of-season dates:

September 28, 29 and 30 October 5, 6, 7 and 8

Cost per trip \$10 (\$20 round trip).
