PARKING ATTENDANT

The parking attendant for the period June to October 2014 is Anthony Mercier.

In accordance with By-law 2015-575, the hourly parking rate is \$1.00 and the daily rate is \$5.00 for automobiles and motorcycles. For trailers, an additional \$2.00 a day is required. You can now use credit cards in the pay-and-display machines. Parking permits must be in plain sight and parking stickers always current and correctly displayed in order to avoid parking violations.

It is forbidden to leave the motor of a vehicle running when it is parked in the municipal parking areas.

Every boat owner must get his boat washed at the washing station to receive a washing certificate before launching the boat . The costs of user certificates (stickers) for residents are as follows:

CECHOS OF THE COUNCIL MEETINGS

FEEDBACK ON THE COUNCIL MEETINGS OF APRIL 7TH AND MAY 5TH 2014

- A grant of \$100 was awarded to the Lake Massawippi Conservation Club in order that it may continue its trout stocking project in Lake Massawippi
- The contract of employment of the town manager, Mr. Léonard Castagner, was renewed to the end of the year.
- A resolution was passed to the effect that all members of ad hoc committees of the municipality be required to sign a pledge of confidentiality with respect to confidential and personal information obtained while performing their duties.
- An amount of \$6,000 was paid to the Association des commerçants de North Hatley (ACNH) (merchants' association) to open, close and maintain the tourist pavilion located at 300, rue Mill from May 1st to October 31st.
- The town council adopted a plan of communication to keep the citizens up to date on important decisions made by the council.
- A request was made to Canada Post to maintain access to the post office boxes on Saturdays at the village post office.

- An amount of \$300 was given to Maison Aube-Lumière to sponsor a golf hole at its annual tournament.
- The municipalities served by the Sûreté du Québec station of the Memphrémagog MRC agree to adopt standardized by-laws in order to facilitate their enforcement by the Sûreté du Québec.

By-law RU 2014-575 is in force. This bylaw replaces by-law number RU 2010-544 concerning parking and management of public roads and amendments RU 2011-557 and RU 2012-564

By-law RU 2014-576 replacing By-law RU 2010-541 concerning nuisances was passed.

By-law RU 2014-577 replacing by-law number RU 2010-545 concerning safety, peace and order is in force.

By-law RU 2014-578 amending by-law number 2009-535 on fire safety was passed.

URBAN PLANNING

WHO & WHAT ARE THE EDC / NOW THE SDC?

The Economic Development Committee derived from the defunct Strategic Planning Committee, which was formulated by former Mayor Stephan Dore. The first meeting was June 17th, 2008. The one year mandate of this committee was to consider a developmental plan to improve the quality of living for the citizens of North Hatley. The committee was in operation for three years.

The conclusions drawn were as follows:

- 1. Generational equilibrium/balance of the population
- 2. Architectural Cachet
- 3. Quality of the Environment
- 4. Regional Leadership and Pooling of Services
- 5. Tourism
- 6. Financial Aspects
- 7. Various Items

As a result of the above, the SPC recommended that an EDC be formulated to implement the above conclusions. In addition, the EDC would begin to collect data, which would enable the construction of a municipal master plan for North Hatley. Consequently the EDC has been working towards these goals since their first meeting on March 27th, 2012.

At the first EDC meeting on the above date, Gerald Ostiguy was voted chair, Morgan Quinn as 2nd chair and Dara Jane Loomis as secretary. The committee met monthly and was in operation until the past municipal election last November (2013). Prior to this, the EDC had subdivided members to research the following areas, which would be instrumental in constructing a municipal master plan. The EDC further entertained ideas from Urbanism students from both the U. de M. and McGill University.

- 1. Funding
- 2. Tourism
- 3. Space & Recreation
- 4. Housing
- 5. Circulation
- 6. Governance
- 7. Town Square Concept

However it was clear by the summer of 2013 that the amount of work required by the master plan development initiative was far too overwhelming for the majority of EDC sub-committee members. In addition to this obstacle, the purchase of a good portion of the down town core by Mr. R. Laliberté raised concerns with council with the given mandate of the EDC. Further with the upcoming November municipal election, Council requested that the EDC

halt all work on the Town Square Concept until the above obstacles could be properly processed. Consequently the EDC's last meeting prior to the election was Aus. 15th, 2013.

The fall out effects from the above made it difficult to attain a quorum at our last few meetings, including our first on Nov. 28th, following the election. As a result of a number of factors, some members resigned, while others requested a leave of absence, therefore a request for "new members" was advertised in the Info Village. In the meantime, the remainder of the committee discussed the EDC mandate and decided to initiate a more manageable design with the development of a master plan. As a result of resignations, a new executive was voted in. They are as follows:

Morgan Quinn – Chair

Margot Heyerhoff - 2nd chair

Dara Jane Loomis – Secretary.

The main objectives of the EDC are to identify rejuvenation ideas and formulate them into an implementation plan. The committee decided to choose one long term goal and a small number of short term goals as a plan of action. Anything decided upon by the EDC would be presented to Council for approval. Consequently the chair would attend the working meeting of Council to ensure proper communication of items decided upon by the EDC.

We invite citizens of North Hatley to stay tuned to upcoming exciting new projects that will involve all in the community, who feel so inclined to volunteer time and expertise. As of the last meeting on Thursday, Feb. 20th, the EDC decided upon a name change, better reflecting the mandate of sustainable rejuvenation. Consequently it will now be referred to as the Sustainable Development Committee.

2014 BULKY WASTE PICKUP

Bulky waste will be picked up

- on the following dates: • July 10th;
- August 7th.

Please take note that the following articles will not be picked up:

- Tires
- Hazardous waste (paint, batteries, oil, etc.)
- Cement products (slabs, etc.)
- Refrigerator containing freon
- **BUILDING MATERIALS**
- Items more than 4 feet (1.20 m) long
- Items weighing more than 70 lbs (32 kg)
- No materials from a truck or trailer left at the curb will be picked up

* Please note that only bundled branches will be picked up. Loose branches will not be picked up.



Make sure your items are on the side of the road before the date of the collection. These must not encroach onto the public roads. It is forbidden to leave bulky waste on the side of the road after these collection dates.

The CCUP is responsible for looking into and submitting recommendations to the municipal council on issues relating to town planning, zoning, subdivision and building in accordance with Article 146 of the Act respecting Land Use Planning and Development and any issues relating to heritage protection, particularly, under Chapter 4 of the Cultural Property Act.

CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE ON **URBANISM AND HERITAGE (CCUP)**

Most applications for construction permits require the recommendation of the Consultative Committee on Urbanism and Heritage (CCUP). If you are planning to build or renovate, allow sufficient time for the building and environment inspector of the municipality to look at your project (plans, sketches, etc.) and the CCUP to approve it.

To this effect, we would ask that you submit for the CCUP, at least one week prior to the next meeting date of the committee, any plan documents (placement and elevation drawings), product samples and photographs of your residence that may be required for a complete review of your project. Please note that the CCUP reserves the right to postpone a decision if it deems that additional information is required.

MESSAGES FROM THE C.C.E

Beware of Pesticides!

Protect your children, your pets and all other beings. Remember : Nature will handle most garden infestations if allowed to do so. Preventive measures, as simple as good soil management, will often be the key to a healthy garden. Spraying pesticides, whether herbicides, fungicides, insecticides or other biocides, destroys the natural guardians of your lawn, trees and gardens. Not only their enemies! Only in cases of extreme infestation should one have recourse to pesticides. However only *low-impact pesticides*¹, that have a minimal effect on the environment and on human health, are allowed by law and that, only under certain conditions! Whether you intend to use pesticides yourself or hire a specialized company, permission must be obtained from the Municipality. Inform yourself! Ask to see the municipal bylaw on pesticide use! Talk to your neighbours!

¹ For more details on "Low-impact pesticides" see the municipal Bylaw no. 02-442 governing the use of pesticides, article 1.2

DID YOU KNOW ?


THE RUBIK'S CUBE HAS 43.252.003.274.489.856.000 POSSIBLE COMBINATIONS!

The Rubik's Cube is a puzzle made in 1974 by "Erno Rubik", a Hungarian sculptor and professor of architecture, this cube became over time the most famous puzzle worldwide.



With these six faces, each consisting of a homogeneous color and different from the others, and the exterior surfaces 54, the cube comprises over 43 trillion possible combinations. In fact, if you turn the Rubik's cube once per second, it would take 1,400 trillion years to go through all the configurations of the cube, if you started this project during the Big Bang, it still would'nt be completed yet.






