#### DEPARTURE OF MICHAEL MUNKITTRICK

Michael Munkittrick is resigning as Councillor following 11 years of involvement in the municipal life of North Hatley. He has been a member of the Consultative Committee on Urbanism and Heritage (CCUP) for a number of years and his involvement in the North Hatley Recreation Society (NHRS) spans decades. He has also been active in various other organizations.

### FIRE PERMIT - PROCEDURES

With the nice season starting, the municipality would like to remind you of the procedures to follow to get a fire permit.

### BEFORE LIGHTING A FIRE PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW FOR A FIRE DURING THE WEEK:

You must get authorization from the municipality by phoning the town hall. If a permit is granted, it is important to provide the following information:

• The name of the person responsible to oversee the fire;

- The address where the fire will be, as well as your phone number;
- The purpose of the fire as well as the expected duration;

Please note that the authorization is valid only for the day it was delivered and that a new permit must be issued each day.

#### PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW FOR A FIRE ON THE WEEKEND ONLY:

It is your responsibility to check if weather conditions are favourable before lighting a fire (wind factor, dryness, etc); this information is available from Environment Canada at (819) 564-5702.

If weather conditions allow for a fire, you must leave the following information on the answering machine of the Municipality to ensure that your permit is recorded and forwarded to the R.I.P.I.

Please leave the following information on their answering machine:

- Your personal information (name, address, phone number);
- The date and the time when you will be lighting the fire.
- The type of fire (camp/brush)

Here are few safety tips to follow when lighting a fire:

- Always have a hose near the fire:
- Have constant supervision at the fireside;
- Make sure the smoke does not cause a nuisance to the neighbours;
- Make sure the fire does not exceed one (1) metre in height.

We greatly appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

### **URBAN PLANNING**

### **CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE ON URBANISM AND HERITAGE (CCUP)**

Most applications for construction permits require the recommendation of the Consultative Committee on Urbanism and Heritage (CCUP). If you are planning to build or renovate, allow sufficient time for the building and environment inspector of the municipality to look at your project (plans, sketches, etc.) and the CCUP to approve it.

To this effect, we would ask that you submit for the CCUP, at least one week prior to the next meeting date of the committee, any plan documents (placement and elevation drawings), product samples and photographs of your residence that may be required for a complete review of your project. Please note that the CCUP reserves the right to postpone a decision if it deems that additional information is required.

### **2015 BULKY WASTE PICKUP**

Bulky waste will be picked up on the following dates:

- August 6<sup>th</sup>;
- Octobre 10<sup>th</sup>.

### Please take note that the following articles will not be picked up:

- Tires
- Hazardous waste (paint, batteries, oil, etc.)
- Cement products (slabs, etc.)
- Refrigerator containing freon
- **BUILDING MATERIALS** •
- Items more than 4 feet (1.20 m) long
- Items weighing more than 70 lbs (32 kg)
- No materials from a truck or trailer left ٠ at the curb will be picked up

Make sure your items are on the side of the road before the date of the collection. These must not encroach onto the public roads. It is forbidden to leave bulky waste on the side of the road after these collection dates.

\* Please note that only bundled branches will be picked up. Loose branches will not be picked up.



#### **BY-LAW ON ZEBRA MUSSELS AND OTHER INVASIVE SPECIES - LAKE AND RIVER MASSAWIPPI**

By-law 2015-582 is meant to prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other invasive species. It's up to us to protect our lake from this environmental threat!

Boat owners are required to have their boats washed at the wash station in order to receive a certificate before heading out on the water. Costs of user certificates for residents are as follows :

A certificate of registration is required for boats of more than 10 HP.

#### GRASSCYCLING A LONG WORD FOR A SIMPLE METHOD

Grasscycling refers to a GRASSCYCLING method of leaving grass clippings on the lawn when mowing. Grass clippings decompose in a day or two. The smaller the clip-



pings, the faster they break down and disappear. A mulching mower makes grasscycling an easy task, however, any type of mower can be used to grasscycle.

If your mower is not equipped with mulch blades, remove the collection bag and mow

Waste management is gradually improving from year to year within the MRC of Memphrémagog, however, 78% of trash bin waste can still be diverted, in other words, either reused, recycled or composted.

#### **Reimbursement plan:**

- 50% of the cost of the domestic composting bin (up to a maximum of \$30)
- 1 composting bin per address only
- until available funds run out

# What to consider when choosing a domestic composting bin:

- an opening that is easily accessible to insert organic waste
- and to turn the compost with little effort

- holes for proper air circulation
- a trap-door at the bottom to easily retrieve the finished compost

Purchase the type of composting bin that you want from a retailer of your choice.

#### To qualify for reimbursement:

- Fill out the form available on the MRC site at www.mrcmemphremagogo.com under « *Programmes et services / Programme de financement de composteurs* »
- Send in the completed MRC form with the original invoice and a copy of some proof of residency
- A cheque and your original invoice will be forwarded to you by mail

harm/damages to persons living in the neighbourhood, in various ways:

- by morally, physically and materially hindering their tranquility, their quality of life as well as those of their guests;
- by barking, howling, whistling, caterwauling or whose repeated cries can hinder their comfort, their peace of mind or their quality of life;
- by damaging their property, whether it is to their building, their furniture, accessories, lawn, garden, flowers, bushes and other plants.

Stray Animals Any person finding a stray animal must advise or bring it to the Société protectrice des animaux (SPA) de l'Estrie.

The SPA de l'Estrie was retained by the Municipal Council of North Hatley to see that the by-laws are upheld. To file a complaint against a citizen who does not respect any of these by-laws, you may communicate with the SPA at 819- 821-4727 Option 5.



### RESPECT FOR MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS

**YOUR PETS** 

#### A QUESTION OF CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY AND HARMONY

In order to ensure harmony between people and pets sharing the same territory, many Townships municipalities have passed a by-law in this respect. Owners and sitters of cats and dogs respecting this

by-law are not only showing civic-mindedness, but are acting as responsible citizens, respectful of their neighbourhood. It is therefore important that each person responsible for a pet cares about the behaviour of their pet.

Among the many measures under the municipal by-laws of North Hatley aimed at protecting both the citizens and the animals, are the following:



**Excrements:** The person in charge of an animal must remove immediately any fecal matter produced by this animal and dispose of it in a hygienic fashion, reasons:

for the following reasons:

- to avoid nasty surprises to people out for a stroll;
- to increase the safety of, and the hygienic conditions of the area for, children playing outside;
- to prevent the transmission of diseases among animals;
- to encourage respect for the citizens and their environment;



**Dogs running free** It is forbidden to let a dog run free. Outside the building, dwelling or property limits, a dog must be kept on a leash and accompanied by a responsible person who can control the animal.

Noise and damages Is considered a nuisance having an animal that causes
