LAST BULKY WASTE PICKUP

The last bulky waste pick up for 2015 will be on the **15th of October**, at the same time as the regular garbage pick up.



Make sure your items are on the side of the road before the date of the collection. These must not encroach on the public roads. It is forbidden to leave bulky waste on the side of the road after these collection dates.

CHIMNEY CLEANING



We wish to thank all homeowners who were diligent in 2014 and had their chimneys cleaned. Doing so helps reduce the number of chimney fires on the territory. Due to the intense cold, 2015 saw a marked increase in the use of wood stoves and fireplaces. Don't forget to make an appointment with your chimney cleaner! According to by-law 2009-535 on fire prevention, it is recommended that chimneys be cleaned at least once a year. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure that their chimney and its components are in good working condition. IMPORTANT INFORMATION -CLOSING UP COTTAGES

If you want your water to be closed, please call (819) 842-2754. A 24-hour advance notice is required.

The work must be done by municipal employees. Should you attempt to do the work yourself or have a third party do it for you, you will be held responsible for any damages.

Do not forget that fees of \$25 per valve apply.





PROCEDURE FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF BURNT OUT STREET LIGHTS

In order to maintain proper street lighting in the village, we would ask that you report a burnt out or flickering street light to the municipality. When contacting us, please have on hand the information posted on the Hydro-Québec pole as shown in the picture below.

A report is sent to the provider once a month in order for the repairs to be done.

FALSE ALARMS... 90 SECOND DELAY TO AVOID THEM!



Remember that the activated alarm signal transmission delay function allows occupants a maximum of 90 seconds to verify the authenticity of the alarm signal and, if need be, to reset the system by entering the access code on the keypad.

A false fire alarm is a

triggered signal that causes an unnecessary response by firefighters and has the potential to:

- Prevent firefighters from attending to genuine emergencies and as such compromise the safety of citizens;
- Increase the risk of danger to emergency responders and citizens when vehicles are driven under emergency situations;
- Be costly to municipalities and taxpayers due to the ineffective use of resources;

• Be subject to a fine in some municipalities.

In order to avoid false alarms, alarm system smoke detectors should be installed away from sources of heat or steam such as in kitchens, rooms with a fireplace, bathrooms or workshops.

Opt for a photoelectric detector: it is less sensitive to light smoke and to steam. Although the activation of the delay function is optional, it is recommended that it be activated for private properties. Contact your security system provider or specialist who maintains the system.

How to maintain a smoke alarm system:

- Replace smoke detectors every 10 years;
- Test smoke detectors twice a year to ensure that they are functioning well;
- Clean smoke detectors on a regular basis using the wand of a vacuum cleaner. Do not remove the cover.
- Notify your home surveillance provider following a power outage or phone line interruption and then test your system.

YOUR PETS

You own a pet and you enjoy walking your companion on public roads, sidewalks, along green spaces throughout the Municipality. For reasons of hygiene and out of respect for your neighbouring citizens, we remind you that it is your responsibility to immediately pick up all 'items' left behind by your animal. Bags for this purpose are made available, free of charge, in Dreamland Park and in parc de la Rivière. Anywhere else on public grounds, please make sure to carry a bag with you at all times.

Scooping is the right thing to do!

Check your alarm system to ensure that battery terminals have not corroded. If batteries show evidence of corrosion or leakage, they should be looked at by a specialist.

URBAN PLANNING

TEMPORARY CAR SHELTERS (ABRI «TEMPO»)

Temporary car shelters are permitted from November 1st to April 15th. They must consist of a metal frame with a canvas or polyethylene cover. They must be installed on a parking spot or access road, at a minimum distance of 1.5 metres (5'), or 3 metres (9'9'') for a corner property, from the edge of the main thoroughfare.

Car shelters must be dismantled completely and stored away out of season.



CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE ON URBANISM AND HERITAGE (CCUP)

Most applications for construction permits require the recommendation of the Consultative Committee on Urbanism and Heritage (CCUP). If you are planning to build or renovate, <u>allow sufficient time</u> for the building and environment inspector of the municipality to look at your project (plans, sketches, etc.) and the CCUP to approve it.

To this effect, we would ask that you submit for the CCUP, at least one week prior to the next meeting date of the committee, any plan documents (placement and elevation drawings), product samples and photographs of your residence that may be required for a complete review of your project. **Please note that the CCUP reserves the right to postpone a decision if it deems that additional information is required**.

WINTER SECTION

SNOW REMOVAL

Please don't forget that you cannot dump snow from your property onto the road, the sidewalks, the lake and onto any municipal property. Do not leave your garbage and recycling bins on the edge of

the road in order not to hinder snow removal and to avoid the breaking of your bins.

EMERGENCY EXIT

Please remember to clear your porches and doors of snow after a snowfall. It is of the utmost importance to have an emergency exit at all times.

PUTTING THE BINS BACK

We would like to remind you that it is your responsibility to return your bins to your backyards after garbage collection day. wplough drivers during snow removal. If you think you will be away at that time, ask your neighbour if he/she could be of service!



CLEAR ACCESS TO FIRE HYDRANTS The Fire Dept. and the Public Works Dept. would like to remind you that it is very important that access to fire hydrants (1 metre circumference around

the hydrant) not be blocked with snow from your property. In the event of an emergency, they need for the hydrants to be quickly accessible.



WALKS IN THE WINTER

Here are a few safety tips to consider when taking walks in the winter, particularly during snow storms. Always wear bright colours, and if possible have reflective stripes on your clothing during your evening walks. Lastly, always walk facing traffic, so that you are visible to snowplough drivers at all times.



OVERNIGHT PARKING

Reflecting bylaw # 2010-544, we wish to remind you that overnight parking is prohibited on all public roads and on the municipal parking lot during the winter season, from **November 1st to April 1st, between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.**

All illegally parked vehicles will be towed away.

LEAF COLLECTION

This year the leaves will be collected around the end of October and the beginning of November. For exact dates of collection and procedures to follow, please check notices.

Please follow the steps below to ensure that your leaves are picked up.

- The leaves **must be put in compostable** paper bags - no biodegradable bags will be picked up;
- No plastic bags will be picked up;
- The bags must not contain pine or fir needles nor any other type of waste;
- The bags must be put on the side of the road and not on the road.

We wish to remind you that, should you miss the collection dates, you have two other alternatives offered to you for the recycling of your dead leaves:

- 1. Shred small amounts of leaves with your lawn mower; these will serve as excellent fertilizer.
- 2. Put them in your brown bin (compostable matter).
