1. September 2016 Council Meeting.

- The winners of the North Hatley in Bloom contest were announced at Council's September meeting. First, second and third prizes were also presented to the winners within the categories of residential, commercial and flower container arrangements. For the first time ever, a Special Jury prize was presented, in order to recognize outstanding horticultural achievement. This year, the winner of this prize was The Hovey Manor for its beautiful flower garden. Council wishes to congratulate all of the winners and to thank them for their wonderful contributions to our village.
- In order to ensure residents' safety in times of emergency, Council has passed a resolution for an agreement between the municipality of the Village of North Hatley and the *Canton de Hatley* for the sharing of building locations as part of their emergency planning.

2. October 2016 Council Meetings.

- Council is happy to announce the appointment of three new members to its CCUP (Town Planning and Heritage Committee): Mr. Richard Gourde, Mr. Richard Lalumière and Mr. Serge Rodrigue. Council would like to welcome its new CCUP members and to thank them for their valuable contribution to our village. The CCUP has also been given a new mandate by Council which involves making recommendations for the creation of a new bylaw for the issuance of permits for building demolition.
- A notice was given at the October 3rd council meeting for a resolution that was passed at its October 6th extraordinary meeting. This meeting was held in order to approve a loan to cover the refinancing costs of a significant portion of the municipality's debt which is due to be refinanced on December 20th 2016.

3. North Hatley joins municipalities of the MRC Memphrémagog to help revitilize Mount Orford Park.

Council decided not to exercise its right to withdraw from a revitilization project of Mount Orford Park. Sixteen out of the seventeen municipalities within the MRC Memphrémagog have chosen to support this project which will update existing infrastructure and make Mount Orford a year round destination. The MRC used municipal assessment values to calculate the percentage contribution of each municipality, with the municipalities of Orford and Magog covering approximately 60% of the total contribution from all of the municipalities. North Hatley's contribution, which represents 1.8%, will be \$4,562.90 per year for a period of five years. Due to Mount Orford Park's proximity to our village, both North Hatley residents and North Hatley businesses will benefit from this contribution to the project

4. Upcoming Public Consultations for MADA (Senior Friendly Municipality) protocol initiative.

The MADA committee has been hard at work with its new project manager, Mrs. Daphnée Poirier. The committee is now ready to consult with the general population in order to help it to define and recommend an effective seniors' policy to Council. The adoption of a new policy will not only guide the municipality in the making of future decisions regarding community programs and capital investments, but it will also enable the municipality to apply for much needed funding from the provincial government to help make these programs and investments a reality. The provincial government is already assisting North Hatley financially during the MADA process and MADA recognition will enable the municipality to seek out more substantial funding for future projects.
