### The BBQ - keep an eye on your summer stove!

Summer's here and so is cooking on the BBQ! Beware of fire hazards! Be sure to clean the racks and burners on a regular basis and check all gas connections. Never leave food cooking on a BBQ unattended. Always store propane gas cylinders in a secure location.

Happy grilling!

This is to inform you that the Municipality has mandated the firm of <u>Groupe GPI</u> to conduct fire prevention and inspection home visits as required under the MRC Memphrémagog fire prevention plan now in force.

The home visits will take place during the months of July and August.

### Lighting a fire - Important Reminder

With the approaching good weather, the Municipality wishes to remind you of the procedure to follow before lighting a fire.

A few simple steps will notify the Régie intermunicipale de protection incendie of planned fire lighting activities on the territory and avoid unnecessary unit displacement.

#### **BEFORE LIGHTING A FIRE:**

Authorization can be obtained by contacting the Municipality at 819 842–2754. It is important to provide the following information:

- The name and phone number of the person overseeing the fire;
- The address where the fire will take place;
- The purpose of the fire, start time and expected end time;

Authorization is valid for the planned day of the fire only. A new permit will be required for all subsequent fires.

Weekends and holidays

Even if authorization has been granted, it is every citizen's responsibility to make sure that weather conditions are favourable before lighting a fire (wind factor, dryness, etc.). All information is available by contacting Environment Canada at 819 564–5702.

The following safety tips must be followed when lighting a fire:

- Have a hose ready, on hand and in close proximity to the fire at all times:
- Make sure there is constant supervision of the fire;
- Make sure the smoke does not hinder neighbors;
- Make sure the fire does not exceed one metre in height.

### Lyme Disease

Lyme disease is caused by bacteria transmitted through the bite of an infected tick.

Lyme disease was first identified in 1977. Many cases, at the time, were reported in children from the town of Lyme, Connecticut, United States. Ever since, thousands of cases have been reported across the United States, Canada and Europe.

Since 2011, there has been an increase in the number of people with Lyme disease in Québec, as well as the number of people that have contracted the illness in the province. The fact that Québec winters are less cold than they used to be partly explains this increase. The warmer climate enables the ticks to survive and grow more easily.

Ticks that transmit Lyme disease are known as "deer ticks" and "blacklegged ticks". They live primarily in the forests, woods and tall grass.

Tick bites are usually painless and often go unnoticed.

If you get bitten by a tick, you should immediately remove it. To know how, see the Removing a Tick After a Bite page. Place the tick you removed from your skin in a tightly closed container, like an empty pill vial. Write down the date and place you were at when bitten. Also note what part of your body you were bitten on. This information could be useful if you go see a doctor.

### How to avoid tick bites

- Take your walks preferably on trails and avoid tall grass.
- Use insect repellent on every exposed part of your body, avoiding your face. Closely follow the instructions for using mosquito repellent.
- Wear a hat, closed shoes, a long-sleeved shirt and long pants.
- Tuck your shirt into your pants.
- Tuck your pants into your socks or boots.
- After outdoor activities:
  - Carefully inspect your belongings (backpack, coat, etc.). Such precaution eliminates the risk of bringing a tick into your house where it could bite someone.
  - Get rid of ticks on your clothes by putting them in the dryer at a high temperature for 6 minutes. If your clothes are too dirty to be put in the dryer directly, wash them in the machine with hot water, ideally for at least 40 minutes. Then put them in the dryer at a high temperature for at least 6 minutes.
    - Also inspect your pets as they may bring ticks into your house. If you find ticks on a pet, remove them and consult a veterinarian if necessary. To obtain information and recommendations regarding ticks on your pets, consult the Ministère de l'Agriculture, des Pêcheries et de l'Alimentation

# Planning a construction or renovation project

A reminder - in order to provide the best service possible the Municipality requires a reasonable delay of time in responding to a request for a permit or certificate.

In general, the Act Respecting Land Use Planning and Development provides a 30-day delay period for the approval process of an application for a building permit or certificate of authorization. The goal of the Municipality is to respond to a request as fast as possible.

We recommend that you contact the Building and Environment Inspector to obtain information on all relevant conditions and documents required to proceed. The time delay to obtain a permit begins the moment that all necessary documents have been received by the municipal Inspector.

Various requests will be subject to analysis by the Comité consultatif d'urbanisme et de patrimoine (CCUP) for recommendation to the municipal Council. Regular meeting dates of the CCUP and municipal Council must be taken into consideration in the timeline for your project. In general, meetings of the CCUP are held every 3rd Wednesday of the month and regular Council meetings are held the 1st Monday of the month.

### By-law on zebra mussels for Lake Massawippi River

By-law 2008-525 is meant to prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other invasive species. It's up to us to protect our lake and our river from this environmental threat! Boat owners are required to have their boats washed at the wash station in order to receive a certificate before heading out on the water. Costs of user certificates for residents are as follows:

<u>Craft</u>	<u>Motorized</u>	Non-motorized
1st craft	\$25	\$5
Additional craft	ts \$15	\$5

A registration certificate is required for boats with 10 hp or more.

Washing and user certificates for pleasure boaters on Lake Massawippi in North Hatley are available at the North Hatley Marina only, 240, Mill Street, between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., seven days a week - 819-842-4433 or 819-572-0357.




