OVERNIGHT PARKING

A reminder that in keeping with by-law # 2010-544, overnight parking is prohibited on all public roads and in the municipal parking lot during the winter season, from November 1 to April 1, between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

All illegally parked vehicles will be towed away at the owner's expense and are subject to a fine.

Always clear your balcony and doorways of snow following a snowfall.

A second exit should be kept clear of snow and accessible at all times in the event of an emergency.





CLEAR ACCESS TO FIRE HYDRANTS

The Fire Department and Public Works Department would like to remind you that it is very important that access to fire hydrants (1-metre circumference around the hydrant) not be blocked with snow from your property. Fast access to the hydrants in the event of an emergency is essential at all times.

SNOW REMOVAL

Please note that in accordance with municipal regulations, it is forbidden to dump snow from your property onto the road, the sidewalks, into the lake and onto any municipal property. Please keep your garbage and recycling bins away from the side of the road so as not to hinder snow removal and to avoid damage to your bins.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Trash bin:

- Garland (metallic or laminated);
- Wrapping paper (metallic or laminated);
- Gift bags (metallic or laminated);
- Christmas lights (recyclable at ecocentres);
- Artificial Christmas tree (recyclable at eco

Recycling bin:

- Tissue paper;
- Plastic tablecloth (cleaned and placed in a plastic bag);
- Paper gift bags **NON**-laminated (with ribbon or cord handle removed).

Compost bin:

- Soiled paper tablecloths;
- Paper napkins;
- Cardboard dishes NON-laminated;
- Compostable dishes identifed as such.



CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP – ONE DAY ONLY

This year, Sani-Estrie will be in charge of picking up Christmas trees, on Thursday January 11th, 2018 **only**. Trees must be placed by the side of the road before 7 a.m. that day. There will be no other Christmas tree pickup after that date.

Guidelines to follow:

- Make sure there are no Christmas decorations left on the tree;
- Do not cover your tree in plastic;
- Protect your tree from the elements until the scheduled pickup date;
- Place the tree along the driveway, free of snow and ice. It is important to keep the tree away from the road so as not to hinder snow-clearing work.

WINTER COMPOSTING

As of November 10, compost bin collection takes place once a month only.

Please contact Town Hall for the 2018 pickup schedule.

To prevent compost material from freezing and sticking to the bin, compostable liners for your bin can be purchased in a number of stores. You can also place a piece of flat cardboard at the bottom of your empty bin to avoid freezing and sticking of compost material.

We also recommend that you avoid disposing of liquids in your brown bin.

CARING FOR YOUR PET DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Glittery Christmas decorations, tasty treats, rich table scraps, holiday or other plants are all tempting to your four-legged pet, but potentially dangerous for their health.

Food and Drink

Chocolate: it is highly toxic for your dog or cat. Keep all chocolate and food that contains chocolate away from your pet.

Chicken bones: avoid giving them to your pet, when cooked they can splinter and get stuck in their throat, damage/perforate the digestive system and cause choking or asphyxiation.

Leftovers: ask that your guests not offer them to your pet. Although they taste great to animals, they are often too rich or spicy and not suitable for their digestive system and could make them sick.

Candies, **pastries** and **baked products**: they often contain xylitol (artificial sweetener) that can cause liver disease and even liver failure. Instead, give your pet treats specifically designed for animals.

Alcohol: keep your pet away from alcohol, it is a highly **HARMFUL** substance for your cat or dog (risks of intoxication: vomiting, unsteady movement and low body temperature). If you suspect alcohol ingestion by your pet, take it to the vet immediately.

Other foods to avoid: onions, grapes or raisins, nuts and avocados.

Plants

The ingestion of some types of plants can be harmful for pets. They include:

- **Holly** (digestive disorders and nervous system breakdown)
- **Poinsettia** (light to moderate digestive disorders).
- Mistletoe (severe irritation of the digestive tract, drop in the heart rate and of the body temperature, difficulty breathing, lack of balance, excessive thirst, seizures, coma, even death.)

In case of ingestion, call your vet immediately.
