
It includes a bike pump and other universal tools for bike, stroller or baby jogger maintenance.

The shuttle, *Le Wippi*, navigates the waters of Lake Massawippi throughout the summer season, 7 days a week, 6 times a day.

shuttle The service is available to pedestrians and bikers to cross the lake between the municipalities of Ayer's Cliff and North Hatley. It can accommodate up to 12 people with or without their bikes. Boarding points are the municipal wharfs in Ayer's Cliff (route 141, across from the rest area) and North Hatley (rue Main, across from rue School).

Reservations are required. Each trip lasts approximately one hour. The shuttle service is a great way to connect from the Grandes-Fourches bike path (via Axe du sommet or Axe de la Massawippi) to the Tomifobia Nature Trail.



Seasonal Reminders

Again this year - a reminder to everyone on the importance of preventing Lyme disease. Since 2011, there has been an increase in the number of people who have contracted Lyme disease - in 2017, 329 cases were reported in Québec.

Lyme disease is caused by the bacteria *Borrelia burgdorferi* (Bb), transmitted to humans by the blacklegged tick also known as the deer tick bite. Ticks are found mainly in forests, wooded areas, brush, shrubs and tall grasses.

By-law 2008-525 is meant to prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other invasive species.

The responsibility is ours to protect our lake and our river from this environmental threat! Boat owners are required to have their boats washed at the wash station in order to receive a certificate before heading out on the water.

User certificates for residents are available at the following costs:

<u>Craft</u>	<u>Motorized</u>	<u>Non-motorized</u>
1st craft	\$40	\$5
Additional crafts	\$25	\$5

A registration certificate is required for boats with 10 hp or more.

Wash and user certificates for pleasure boaters on Lake Massawippi in North Hatley are only available at the North Hatley Marina, 240, Mill Street, between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., seven days a week - 819-842-4433 or 819-572-0357.

Whenever you set out to mow your lawn or to use some sort of power tool or equipment (saws, hedge trimmers, etc.), it is important to consider the impact of noise on the neighbourhood.

Equipment of this type emits excessive noise that can be a disturbance to neighbours.

To live in a quiet and peaceful community means being conscious of the right of neighbours to a tranquil existence and of the need to reduce noise disturbances. Good communication between neighbours makes for good relationships.

Excessive noise can become an annoyance leading to resentment and conflict within the neighbourhood. Situations such as these can be avoided by working at respectful community relationships.
