

Call2Recycle national program

In order to maintain a proactive role in helping to protect our environment, the Municipality of the Village of North Hatley has become a collection program participant in the recycling and management program for cell-phones and batteries – Call2Recycle.

Under the **Call2Recycle** program, the recycling process for cell-phones and batteries consists in gathering as many components as possible that will then go towards producing new products.

The by-products from recycled cell-phones and batteries, such as cadmium, lead, cobalt and zinc, can be recycled and used to make new rechargeable cell-phones and batteries.

Accepted Items



The nickel metal hybrid battery.

This type of battery is usually found in cordless tools, digital cameras, two-way radios and cordless phones.



The nickel cadmium battery. Cadmium can be toxic for the environment and should be recycled.

This type of battery is found cordless tools, digital cameras, two-way radios and cordless phones.



Lithium-ion batteries.

This type of battery is found in cell-phones, laptop computers, two-way radios and cordless tools.



Primary/one-time use cells and batteries. Alkaline batteries, with lithium, silver oxide, zinc-air, zinc, carbon and zinc chloride, better known as AA, AAA, 9V and D batteries, and button batteries, are all primary type batteries.

Primary/one-time use batteries are most often found in energy-efficient appliances, such as flashlights, clocks, watches, TV remotes and smoke detectors.

Properly handle batteries by either bagging them in sealed bags or by taping the terminals, and dispose of them in appropriate recycling containers (such as in recycling containers at Call2Recycle). Locally, you can drop off cell phones and batteries at the North Hatley Town Hall, 3125, chemin Capelton.

Bulging, corroded or leaking cells or batteries are not accepted. They must be disposed of at Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) sites.

Residential Swimming Pool Safety Regulation

Residential pools, whether above ground, in-ground or even collapsible, pose a significant risk of drowning to young children, especially when they are away from adult supervision and the facilities are not adequately secured.



Please visit the MAMH webpage (www.mamh.gouv.qc.ca) for more information on the bylaw. The bylaw applies to all outdoor residential pools that hold 60 cm or more of water, whether they are in-ground, above-ground or demountable. The by-law does not apply to:

- Spas, except those that can hold more than 2,000 liters of water
- Natural bodies of water
- Bird baths and other decorative ponds that are not intended for swimming.

Bulk Waste Pickup

Pickup dates: July 13th and October 5th 2023

Please note that the following articles WILL NOT be picked up:

- Tires
- Hazardous waste products (paint, batteries, oil, etc.)
- Cement products (slabs, etc.)
- Refrigerators CONTAINING FREON
- BUILDING MATERIALS
- Items more than 4 feet long (1.20 m)
- Items weighing more than 70 lbs (32 kg)
- NO WASTE MATERIAL FROM A TRUCK CONTAINER
 OR TRAILER LEFT AT THE CURB WILL BE PICKED UP



^{*} Branches must be bundled together. Loose branches will not be picked up.

Make sure that your items are placed at the side of the road before the date of the pickup. They must not encroach on public roads. No bulk waste can be left at the side of the road after the collection dates.

Applicable regulations, which are in fact municipal by-laws, are easy to adhere to, and require little effort




Keep your dog on a leash

Your dog is not permitted to run loose in public spaces. Beyond the limits of your home or property, it absolutely has to be kept on a leash and accompanied by a person who has control over it.

Stoop & Scoop

Out of respect for other people enjoying public spaces, you are required to pick up your animal's fecal waste and dispose of it hygienically. That said don't forget your disposal bags when you leave home!







Register your dog

You must register your dog or pet with the SPA de l'Estrie. The municipal by-law is for safety reasons. In the event that your pet runs away, gets lost or has an accident, it will be easier to locate you because of the tag around the animal's neck; the code engraved on the tag makes it possible for the SPA de l'Estrie to find your information instantly and contact you right away.
